As We Gather – “A Simple Discipleship Rhythm for Families”

This is the fourth weekend of our sermon series, *“Joining Jesus as a family.”* Last week, we looked at how we can use God’s love to grow in our ability to help others by practicing five mission skills. They are: 1) Seeking the Kingdom, 2) Hearing from Jesus in the Gospels, 3) Talking with People, 4) Doing Good, and 5) Ministering through Prayer. Today, we will see how we can weave Jesus’ discipleship rhythm into the daily life of our family by: teaching them, showing them, sending them, and then, circling up and sharing the stories of what everyone learned as they joined Jesus.




