# Tax Effectiveness in Christian Giving

Honor the LORD with your wealth and with the first fruits of all your produce; then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine. Proverbs 3:9-10

Whatever you do, do it enthusiastically, as something done for the Lord and not for men, knowing that you will receive the reward of an inheritance from the Lord. You serve the Lord Christ. Colossians 3:23-24

Part of being a good steward is using the resources that God has given you as effectively as possible. Paying less taxes on the money you donate would be one way. How can you get more bang for your bucks? One way for some of us now, and others in the future is by making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) from your traditional IRA.

A QCD is a distribution from an IRA made directly to an eligible charity (South Shore Trinity is an eligible charity). Owners of individual retirement accounts who are at least age 70 1/2 can contribute some or all of their IRAs (up to the \$105,000 limit) to charity that you would otherwise be forced to receive and pay taxes on. The funds must be directly transferred from the IRA custodian to the eligible charity.

If you have a traditional IRA, you must begin taking required minimum distributions (RMDs) when you reach age 73, even if you don't want or need the money at that point in time. These distributions are taxable at ordinary income rate, whatever tax bracket you're in that particular year. You can avoid being taxed on the RMDs that you must take from your IRA(s) by replacing taxable RMDs with tax-free QCDs.

Because income from a QCD doesn't become part of your 1040 adjusted gross income (AGI), QCDs can be used to help keep your (AGI) and taxable income within a desired range. This can help prevent your income from reaching certain thresholds and reduce income tax.

QCDs always deliver a tax benefit while "regular" charitable donations might not. The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) almost doubled the standard deduction amounts, and you only get a tax benefit from a charitable donation if your total itemized deductions exceed your standard deduction. For non-itemizers, donating to charity via a direct transfer out of an IRA is the only way to get a tangible tax benefit from your donation.

Itemizers also can receive tax benefits. I have received substantial benefits in both the years that I have itemized and in the year that I had taken the standard deduction, which has allowed me to increase my contribution. This is the time to start planning for the 2024 tax vear.

Tax laws change periodically and the above information may not reflect new changes. You should consult with a tax professional for the most up-to-date information and advice that is most advantageous to your specific application.
